EWSETA COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) LOCKDOWN MEASURES: EMPLOYERS / TRAINING PROVIDERS

The COVID-19 pandemic that has resulted in the pronouncement of a State of Disaster, an initial lockdown of three weeks and the extension of the lockdown by a further two weeks, necessitated that the EWSETA attend to all active projects and those that were newly approved just before the lockdown commenced on 26 March 2020.

On 18 April 2020, the Minister of Higher Education, Science and Technology, Dr BE Nzimande published Directive 05/2020 to all SETAs instructing that payment of stipends to learners during the nationwide lockdown should be continued in full until further notice. It should be noted that Directive 05/2020 rescinds all prior communication relating to the matter of learner stipends.

Implementing institutions are therefore required to submit payment claim files as per the timelines and deliverables stated within the Service Level Agreement. Proof of the payment of stipends during the lockdown period through the provision of supporting documentation will also be required.
